<b>Cheverny, Domaine du Salvard 06</b> 90% Sauvignon and 10% Chardonnay from this little known village. A wonderful mix of citrus and fresh cut herbs folded into a slightly creamy texture.	<b>6.5</b>	<b>10.5</b>	<b>52.</b>

<b>Greco di Tufo, Feudi di San Gregorio 05 Campania, Italy</b> An ancient grape variety that was believed to have been brought to southern Italy by the early Greek settlers. <b>Bandol, Domaine de Terrebrune 04</b> Beautiful winery in the south of France practising sustainability. Mainly Mourvèdre with a little Cinsault and Grenache. <b>Côtes-du-Rhône, Dom. de la Janasse 06 <i>Rhône Valley, France</i></b> A blend of Grenache, Syrah and Mourvèdre. Classic CDR with notes of liquorice, red fruits, spice and coriander. Top-flight producer.	6.5	10.5	53.
<b>Moulin-à-Vent, Domaine du Dime 06 <i>Beaujolais, France</i></b> The village of Moulin-à-Vent produces the most sturdy expression of the Gamay grape. Raspberries and cranberries mesh well with subtle earth and pronounced acidity.	7.	12.	59.
<b>Pinot Noir 'Sonoma Coast', Schug Vineyards 06 <i>California, U.S.A.</i></b> Consistently a producer of crowd pleasing Pinot. Crimson colour, strawberry jam nose and a wonderful silky smooth texture.	8.5	14.	69.
<b>Shiraz-Viognier, Terlato &amp; Chapoutier 05 <i>Victoria, Australia</i></b> Joint venture in Australia between Michel Chapoutier from the Rhône and Napa's Anthony Terlato. This deep, high toned and spicy Shiraz is blended with 5% Voignier, adding an exotic floral quality. Full bodied though retains focus and balance	8.	13.	65.
<b>Malbec Reserva, Bodega Sottano 06 <i>Mendoza, Argentina</i></b> Black in colour, but very succulent and pulpy on the palate, this is a cascading squashed blueberry and blackcurrant style of wine.	9.5	15.5	77.
<b>Montepulciano d'Abruzzo 'Marina Cvetic', Masciarelli 04</b> The grape of the future for Italy. This example is super concentrated with deep wild blueberries and wet earth. Stuns the senses.	9.75	16.	79.
<b>Chateau Daugay St-Emilion Grand Cru 01 <i>Bordeaux, France</i></b> This winery east of the Gironde River is enjoying a string of fantastic vintages.
